ORDER

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, on February 9, 1931, applied for authority to abandon its non-agency station of Luna, located on the Visalia Branch of its San Joaquin Division in Tulare County.

Applicant alleges that no passenger or freight business was transacted at said non-agency station during the year ending September 30, 1930; that the existing agency stations nearest to Luna are Exeter (two and one-tenth miles West) and Visalia (eight miles East); and that, in applicant's opinion, the continued maintenance of the non-agency is not necessary for the business of applicant or for the public.

It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to abandon its non-agency station of Luna, located on the Visalia Branch of its San Joaquin Division, in Tulare County, State of California, to eliminate said non-agency name from its station records and to cancel, in conformity with

the rules of this Commission, all rate tariffs and time schedules applying at said station.

Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the abandonment of the facilities authorized herein and of its compliance with the conditions hereof.

The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
