O R D E R

The Railway Express Agency, Inc., on February 25, 1931, applied for authority to abandon its agency at Cisco Station in Placer County, State of California, during the period from November 15 to May 15 of each year. It appears that applicant maintains a joint agency with Southern Pacific Company at this point during the period from May 15 to November 15 of each year and that during the balance of the year the caretaker for Southern Pacific Company has acted as agent for the applicant. Southern Pacific Company has removed the caretaker during the winter months and applicant has been unable to find any other person who is willing to act as its agent during this limited period. Applicant states that if the authority herein sought is granted that express shipments during the period the office is closed will have to be put off at owner's risk, and that unless so billed such shipments will be taken to Soda Springs.

It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary here-
in and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the American Railway Express

Agency, Inc., is hereby authorized to abandon its agency at Cisco, in Placer County, during the period from November 15 to May 15 of each year, providing that applicant shall continue to accept express shipments destined to said station, when such shipments are billed "Put off at owner's risk."

The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
