BY THE COMMISSION:

SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Good Cause Appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Commission's Decision No. 22804, issued August 22nd, 1930, being the First Supplemental Order in this proceeding, is hereby revoked and of no further force and effect.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the grade crossing of the State Highway (Road IV-SCL-2A) over the tracks of Peninsular Railway Company and Southern Pacific Company (Crossing No. EN-32.3), located in the vicinity of Mayfield, City of Palo Alto, and as authorized for improvement by Decision No. 22724, dated August 4th, 1930, in this proceeding, be protected by an additional wigwag signel, thereby providing two No. 3 wigwag signals as prescribed in the Commission's General Order No. 75, subject to the following conditions:

The expense of installing and maintaining said signals shall be borne in accordance with an (1) agreed plan between Southern Pacific Company and Peninsular Railway Company, a copy of which shall be filed with this Commission within thirty (30) days from the date of this order.

- (2) In the event the above condition is not complied with, the Commission will, by supplemental order, apportion the cost of installing and maintaining said signals between the said two carriers.
- (3) Southern Pacific Company shall, within thirty
 (30) days from the date of this order, proceed with the installation of said second wigwag signal, which shall be in service within sixty (60) days from the date of this order.

The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders in this matter as to it may seem right and proper and to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, public convenience and necessity demand such action.

In all other respects the Commission's decisions heretofore entered in this proceeding shall remain in full force and effect.
