OPINION

California Truck Company, a corporation, engaged in a general drayage business and also claiming to have the right to operate a warehouse business in the City of Los Angeles, by virtue of having been actually operating in good faith as a warehouseman in 1927, applies for permission to transfer to California Truck Co., Inc. (which asks permission to purchase), all of its right to operate and transact the business of a warehouseman. The consideration for the transfer is one dollar (\$1.00). The reason for the application, as expressed therein and in the testimony adduced, is that applicant, California Truck Company, desires to dispose of that portion of its business which is subject to regulation.

In this application, it is unnecessary to pass upon the character or extent of the right of California Truck Company as a warehouseman, which has been of a somewhat unsubstantial character, as evidenced by its annual reports on file, which show a gross revenue from its warehouse business in 1927 of but \$2.25, in 1928

of but \$99.79, in 1929 of \$543.10, and in 1930 of only \$165.00. There seems to be no reason why the permission sought should not be granted.

I recommend the following form of order.

O R D E R

A public hearing having been had in the above entitled action, and the matter having been submitted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that California Truck Company may sell to California Truck Company, Inc., and California Truck Company, Inc., may purchase, for the sum of one dollar (\$1.00), whatever operative rights as a warehouseman California Truck Company has in the City of Los Angeles.

The foregoing opinion and order are hereby adopted as the opinion and order of the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
