In the Matter of the application of MILTON BAILEY for authority to discentinue operation of an automobile service as a common carrier between San Diego, California, and Palomer Mountain, California.

OPINION UNIONAL

This is an application by Milton Bailey seeking authority to discontinue and abandon all service as a common carrier for the transportation of passengers and property between San Diego, California, and Palomar Mountain, California, and intermediate points.

The applicant relies as justification for the authority sought, and alleges, that during the calendar year of 1930 his total receipts for the transportation of passengers and property were \$67.57, while his expenses for the same priod of time were \$236.25, the result being that for the period in question the applicant suffered a loss from operations of \$168.68.

We are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled application be and it hereby is granted, subject to the condition that the applicant herein immediately issue appropriate supplements conceling all teriffs and time schedules now on file with this Commission in said applicant's name.
