



Decision No. 22702

BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of Southern Pacific Company for authority to cancel all freight rate tariffs to and from the non-agency station of Eckley in the County of Contra Costa, State of California, and to discontinue the handling of freight at that point.

BY THE COMMISSION:

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, on June 5, 1931, applied for authority to cancel all freight rate tariffs to and from its non-agency station of Eckley, located in Contra Costa County, and to discontinue the handling of freight at said point.

Applicant alleges that \$65.00 less than carload and \$3,004.00 carload freight business was transacted at said station during the year ending December 31, 1930; that at present said Eckley is published as a station at which freight in any quantity, carloads or less, will be received or delivered; that it proposes to include said Eckley within the Port Costa switching limits; that the freight business now handled at Eckley can conveniently be handled at Port Costa Station and that it will no longer be necessary or desirable to

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continue to publish said Eckley as a station at which freight will be received or delivered.

It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to cancel all freight rate tariffs to and from Eckley and to discontinue the handling of freight at said point.

The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
