BY THE COMMISSION: ORDER Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, on June 16th, 1931, applied for authority to abandon its agency at Floriston Station, in Nevada County, State of California. Applicant alleges that its main source of revenue at said station has in the past been derived from handling the shipments of the Crown Willemette Paper Company; that said industry has discontinued operations at this point; that the nearest agency to the East is at Verdi, Nevada, a distance of 10 miles, and to the West at Truckee, a distance of 142 miles; that the abandonment of said agency will not involve the abandonment of any facilities; that the station will be continued as a nonagency station; and that, in applicant's opinion, the continued

The industry involved has advised the Commission that it has no objection to closing said agency and it appearing that a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted,

maintenance of the agency is not necessary for the business of

applicant or for the public.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to abandon its agency at its station of Floriston, located in Nevada County, and to change its station records and tariffs accordingly; provided that said station be continued as a non-agency station.

Applicant shell, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the abandonment of the facilities authorized herein and of its compliance with the conditions hereof.

The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
