OPINION

California Water Service Company, a corporation, applicant in the above entitled proceeding and operating a public utility water works serving consumers residing in a territory contiguous to the easterly boundary line of the City of Los Angeles and known as Belvedere, asks the Railroad Commission for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to exercise rights and privileges heretofore granted to it by the County of Los Angeles under Ordinance No. 1941 (New Series).

A public hearing in this matter was held before Examirer Kennedy at Los Angeles on August 11, 1931.

The evidence shows that applicant was granted authority by the Railroad Commission in its Decision No. 22945, dated October 7, 1930, to purchase and take over a certain water system
