## ORDER

The Western Pacific Railroad Company, a corporation, on August 31, 1931, applied for authority to construct its main line track at grade across a county road running from Crescent Mills to Greenville and at grade across a county road running from Greenville to Westwood, County of Plumas, State of California. Applicant alleges that applications have been filed with the County of Plumas, requesting permission for said crossings, but due to negotiations with said county with respect to proposed road changes and possible future separation of grades, resolutions authorizing said crossings have not as yet been passed by the Board of Supervisors of said county. It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein; that it is neither reasonable nor practicable at this time to provide grade separations or to avoid grade crossings at points mentioned and that temporary, grade crossings should be authorized at this time subject to

- (6) The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.
- (7) The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders, relative to the location, construction, operation, maintenance and protection of said crossings, as to it may seem right and proper and to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, public convenience and necessity demand such action.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
