OPINION AND ORDER

In this proceeding the Railroad Commission has been asked to make an order authorizing Isaac Jones, duly appointed Executor of the Estate of Wellington Arthur Freemire, Deceased, to transfer to Walter Martini the warehouse business, machinery, equipment and the ground lease to the property located and operated as a public utility in the City of Chino, California. Copy of Order No. 9836 of the Superior Court of the State of California in and for the County of San Bernardino, approving and confirming the sale, is attached to the application. Applicants state the warehouse will continue to be operated as a public utility by Walter Martini under the rates, rules and regulations governing the storage and handling of beans as shown in Warehouse Tariff No. 3, C.R.C. No. 5, effective July 17, 1922, and filed in the name of Freemire and Nichols.

The proposed transfer will not result in curtailment of service but should result in a more efficient and economical operation.

We are of the opinion that this is a matter not requiring a formal hearing and that the application should be granted,

therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled application be and the same is hereby granted, subject to the following conditions:

1. Isaac Jones, Executor of the Estate of Wellington Arthur Freemire, and Walter Martini shall join in common supplement to the tariff now on file with the Railroad Commission in the name of Freemire and Nichols, applicant Isaac Jones on the one hand withdrawing and applicant Walter Martini on the other hand accepting and adopting as his own such tariff and all effective supplements thereto.
2. The rights and privileges herein authorized to be transferred may not be sold, leased, transferred or assigned, nor service thereunder discontinued, unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to the sale, lease, transfer or discontinuance has first been secured.
3. The authority herein granted will become effective upon the date hereof.
