THIRD SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER IN APPLICATION 13429
AND PRELIMINARY ORDER ON SUPPLEMENTAL
APPLICATION THEREIN.

On October 3, 1931 there was filed a supplemental application, verified by applicants in September, 1930, being more than one year previous thereto, asking the Commission to approve a schedule of water deliveries as contemplated in the FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER herein, of date March 24, 1927. This supplemental application was called for public hearing at Oroville on October 27, 1931, when after a few minutes spent in the presentation of testimony it was agreed and stipulated by the attorneys of all the interested parties that the matter should go off the calendar pending developments in, and possibly the final determination of, actions filed in the Superior Court of Butte County respecting rights to water claimed by certain protestants and be

replaced on the calendar only upon motion of some of the parties.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that this matter be stricken from the calendar indefinitely and be restored only upon motion by one of the parties, which motion should be accompanied by a definite showing that the said supplemental application is in shape to be heard and disposed of.
