OPINION and ORDER on EIGHTH SUPPLEMENTAL APPLICATION

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In this application (Eighth Supplemental) Pacific Greyhound Lines, Inc. asks authority to re-route its operations over a part of its route in Marin county to take advantage of a newly con structed highway known as the "Alto Cut-off." The granting of this application will not affect applicant's tariffs or schedules on file with the Commission.

Marvelous Marin, Inc., a civic organization of Marin county, has advised the Commission, in writing, under date of December 8, 1931, that it will not oppose the proposed changes.

This does not appear to be a matter in which a public hearing is necessary. We are of the opinion the application should be granted. Therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pacific Greyhound Lines, Inc. be, and it is hereby authorized to

1- Abandon present route between Alto and Tiburon Wye; 2- Operate between Tiburon Wye and Manzanita Wye, and 3- Between Corte Madera Road and Corte Madera,

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as shown on map marked Exhibit B, attached to the application herein, and provided, that the service and re-routing herein authorized shall be operated in connection with and as part of its main system as established by Decision No.23244.
