In the Matter of Application of Petaluma and Santa Rosa Railroad Company for authority to abandon its line in Fourth Street east of the west line of Wilson Street in Santa Rosa, California.	Application No. 17824.

O R D E R

Petaluma and Santa Rosa Railroad Company, a corporation, on November 30, 1931, applied for authority to abandon its line on Fourth Street, east of the west line of Wilson Street in the City of Santa Rosa, State of California.

Applicant alleges that said line of railroad in Fourth Street, Santa Rosa, easterly from the westerly line of Wilson Street, is devoted exclusively to passenger transportation; that passenger traffic on said line has reduced to approximately \$325.00 per year; that said revenue does not meet the expense of maintaining and operating said service; that the City Council of the City of Santa Rosa has authorized the abandonment of said line on Fourth Street by Resolution dated October 6, 1931, and that, in applicant's opinion, public convenience and necessity do not justify the continued maintenance and operation of said line on Fourth Street, Santa Rosa.

It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Petaluma and Santa Rosa Railroad Company is hereby authorized to abandon its passenger service

and remove its track and appurtenances thereto on its line of railroad on Fourth Street, from east of the west line of Wilson Street to its terminus at Fourth and McDonald Streets, City of Santa Rosa, State of California, all of which is shown on the map attached to the application, subject, however, to the following conditions:

- (1) Applicant shall give not less than ten (10) days notice to the public of the abandonment of said passenger service by posting notice in all cars operated in said service.
- (2) Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the abandonment of said service herein authorized and of its compliance with the conditions hereof.
- (3) The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof, unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
