In the matter of the application of A.O. DONOGH and MARION E. DONOGH for discontinuance of the original PARKHILL PUBLIC WATER UTILITY at Concord, California, rates fixed in Application #13193, Decision #17887.

O P I N I O N

In this proceeding A.O. Donogh and Marion E. Donogh, who own and operate a water system known as Parkhill Public Water Utility heretofore supplying a few consumers near the City of Concord in Contra Costa County, ask for authority to discontinue further water service.

A public hearing in this matter was held before Examiner Satterwhite at Concord on December 15, 1931.

According to the testimony, for several years last past this water works has supplied water for domestic and household purposes to four consumers residing in a subdivision known as Ridge Park Tract located in Contra Costa County, near Concord. By reason of the extreme drought applicants' well went dry early this summer and their consumers were forced to secure water from other sources. At the present time all consumers formerly supplied by applicants are now receiving water from the California Water Service Company which has installed a new extension capable of supplying all present residents of Ridge Park Tract.

No protests were made against authorizing the discon-

tinuance of this service and, as no deposits have ever been made by consumers with applicants to guarantee payment of water bills or for service installations and/or main extensions, it appears that this application should be granted.

O R D E R

A.O. Donogh and Marion E. Donogh having made application to this Commission as entitled above, a public hearing having been held thereon, the matter having been submitted and the Commission being now fully advised in the premises,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that A.O. Donogh and Marion E. Donogh be and they are hereby authorized to discontinue public utility water service as of the date of the Order herein and thereupon and thereby stand relieved of all further public utility obligations and liabilities in connection with the service of water heretofore rendered their consumers in the Ridge Park Tract situate in the County of Contra Costa in the vicinity of the City of Concord.

For all other purposes the effective date of this Order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
