ORIGINALSECOND SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

The Pacific Electric Railway Company filed the above entitled supplemental application on January 16, 1932, requesting authority to discontinue the operation of Sunday train service between Los Angeles and Yorba Linda, Fullerton and La Habra.

Applicant now operates Train No. 455 daily from Los Angeles to Fullerton, connecting with Train No. 457 at La Habra for Yorba Linda. Train No. 452 leaves Yorba Linda daily for La Habra, connecting with daily Train No. 454 from Fullerton to Los Angeles. Applicant proposes to discontinue this train service on Sundays only. The week-day service will remain as at present.

A traffic check taken for the above trains, on Sunday, December 20, 1931, shows a total traffic of seven passengers. A saving of approximately \$40.00 monthly will be effected by the elimination of the Sunday service.

The various communities affected by this proposed change were notified, and no protests were received.

It appearing that applicant's request is reasonable, and that a public hearing is not necessary herein,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that authority be, and it is, hereby granted to Pacific Electric Railway Company to discontinue Trains Nos. 452, 454, 455 and 457 on its Los Angeles-Fullerton-La Habra Line, on Sundays only, subject to the following conditions:

1. Applicant shall post notice of said abandonment of Sunday train service, in all cars on said line and at all stations affected, ten (10) days prior to said abandonment of service.

2. Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the changes authorized by this order. If said changes have not been made effective within one (1) year from the date of this order, the authorization herein granted shall then lapse and become void, unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders in this matter as to it may seem right and proper.

For all other purposes, the effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
