Arduino Camillo, Angelo Camillo and Bartie Camillo, a copartnership, operating truck service by authority of certificate granted by Decision No. 16076 dated March 3, 1926 on Application No. 11838 have made application to the Commission to surrender their certificate for cancellation.

Applicants acquired the certificate originally when the only service to be performed by them was the transportation of products of Gladding, McBean & Company at Los Angeles to points outside of the City of Los Angeles. At the time of granting the certificate applicants declared themselves willing to submit to the jurisdiction of the Commission as a private carrier and accepted a certificate. The business of the company has been conducted under this certificate ever since and has not been altered and the partnership still performs the service under exclusive private contract. It is their desire now to put their business on the purely private basis and surrender their certificate. This is a matter in which we believe a public hearing is unnecessary and it appears that the application should be granted.

Arduino Camillo, Angelo Camillo and Bartie Camillo having herein asked that the certificate now held by them for the transportation of products of Gladding, McBean & Company between Los Angeles and various points in southern California heretofore

granted by Decision No. 16076 dated March 3, 1926 on
Application No. 11838 be revoked,

the decision above numbered hereby is revoked and annulled.
