O R D E R

Tidewater Southern Railway Company, a corporation, on May 5th, 1932, applied for authority to abandon its non-agency station and spur track at Diamond, located on its Manteca Branch in San Joaquin County.

Applicant alleges that no passenger nor freight business was transacted at said non-agency station during the year ending March 31st, 1932 and that, in applicant's opinion, the continued maintenance of the non-agency is not necessary for the business of applicant or for the public. Said station is located 1.2 miles south of Manteca Junction and 1.5 miles north of Central Avenue.

It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT Tidewater Southern Railway Company is hereby authorized to abandon its non-agency station of Diamond, in San Joaquin County, State of California; to eliminate said non-agency name from its station records; to cancel, in conformity with the rules of this Commission, all rate tariffs and

time schedules applying at said station and to remove the spur track at said station.

Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the abandonment of the facilities authorized herein and of its compliance with the conditions hereof.

The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) years from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
