In the Matter of the Application of the County of Los Angeles for Order authorizing reconstruction of the existing crossing over right of way of Southern Pacific Railroad Company on Old School River Road into crossing over said right of way on Firestone Boulevard at said point.

BY THE COMMISSION:

FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The County of Los Angeles, applicant herein, has requested in writing on June 4th, 1932, that Condition (3) of Decision No. 23958, dated August 17th, 1931 be modified so as to permit of the construction of the crossing of Firestone Boulevard at grade over the track of Southern Pacific Company with a width of not less than forty (40) feet instead of not less than fifty (50) feet as specified in said Condition (3).

Applicant alleges that subsequent to the filing of this application conditions have changed and as a result the traffic requirements will now be met with a roadway forty (40) feet in width.

Southern Pacific Company has signified in writing that it is agreeable to the proposed modification of said Condition (3).

It appears that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that said request should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Condition (3) of Decision No. 23958 in the above entitled matter be and it is hereby amended to read as follows:

The crossing shall be constructed of a width of not less than forty (40) feet and at an angle of approximately forty-seven (47) degrees to the railroad and with grades of approach not greater than four (4) per cent; shall be constructed equal or superior to type shown as Standard No. 2 in our General Order No. 72; shall be protected by a Standard No. 1 crossing sign, as specified in our General Order No. 75, and shall in every way be made suitable for the passage thereon of vehicles and other road traffic.

In all other respects Decision No. 23958 shall remain in full force and effect.
