ORDER VACATING ORDER OF SUSPENSION AND INVESTIGATION

The Commission by order dated May 23, 1932 in the above entitled proceeding, suspended until June 23, 1932, Supplement No. 3 to Pacific Coast Terminal Warehouse Co. Warehouse Tariff C.R.C. No. 2, filed to become effective June 4, 1932. The supplement was suspended upon protest from the Los Angeles Warehousemen's Association, comprising competing warehousemen at Los Angeles.

The matter was set for hearing before Commissioner Seavey at Los Angeles June 14, 1932. Before the proceeding was heard, however, protestant requested that it be discontinued. Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that our order of May 23, 1932, in the above entitled proceeding suspending Supplement No. 3 to Pacific Coast Terminal Warehouse Co. Warehouse Tariff C.R.C. No. 2, be and it is hereby vacated and set aside.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that this proceeding be and it is hereby discontinued.
