**ORIGINAL**ORDER

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, on June 17, 1932, applied for authority to abandon its non-agency station at Eggers, located on the Clovis Branch of its San Joaquin Division, in Fresno County, California.

Applicant alleges that no passenger business was transacted at said non-agency station during the twelve-month period ending March 31, 1932; that no less-than-carload or carload freight business was transacted during the same period and that, in applicant's opinion, the continued maintenance of the non-agency is not necessary for the business of applicant or for the public. The nearest existing agency to the east of Eggers is Clovis, located a distance of 3.8 miles, and to the west Fresno, a distance of 8.1 miles.

It appears that a public hearing is not necessary herein and that the application should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern Pacific Company

is hereby authorized to abandon its non-agency station of Eggers, located on the Clovis Branch of its San Joaquin Division, in the County of Fresno, State of California; to eliminate said non-agency name from its station records and to cancel, in conformity with the rules of this Commission, all rate tariffs and time schedules applying at said station.

Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the abandonment of the facilities authorized herein and of its compliance with the conditions hereof.

The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof, unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
