ORDER REVOKING CERTIFICATE

On May 10, 1929, by Decision No. 21077 applicant herein was granted certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate an automobile stage line as a common carrier of passengers and express between Coalinga and Standard Oil Company's Camp in Kettleman Hills District. Soon thereafter the Secretary of the Interior for the United States ordered curtailment of oil production and applicant was granted authority to postpone operations at different times because such order made the transportation unnecessary. The last postponement made by Decision No. 24338 herein was made December 21, 1931 and postponed establishment of service until July 1, 1932. Applicant now, in view of the indefinite continuation of such order, requests in writing that the certificate heretofore granted be revoked, and now
