FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Good Cause Appearing Therefor:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that Paragraph Eight (8) under Sub-  
 division D of the order in Decision No. 24332, dated June 6, 1932, be,  
 and the same is hereby, amended so as to read:

8. IT IS HEREBY FOUND AS A FACT that the rate schedules of  
 the several water systems proposed to be acquired by  
 the Santa Clara Valley Public Service Company, now  
 known as Suburban Water Company, insofar as they  
 differ from the schedule of rates here established,  
 are unfair and unreasonable and that the rates herein  
 established are just and reasonable rates to be  
 charged for the service to be rendered, and basing  
 its order upon the foregoing finding of fact, and

on the further statements of fact contained in the opinion which precedes this order, Suburban Water Company is hereby authorized and directed to file with this Commission on or before June 28, 1932, the following schedule of rates to be charged for all service rendered subsequent to the 30th day of June, 1932:-

- (1) For the Valley Zone comprising the greater portion of the area to be served.
- (2) For the Hill Zone in the Loyola District, in the area where an additional pumping lift is required over and above the first lift at the well sites, and which cannot be served by the head of water at elevation 325 feet; in general; the area located above Arbor Avenue and above the avenue along Permanente Creek including East Terrace Drive.

MONTHLY METER MINIMUMS

Size of Meter	Valley Zone	Hill Zone
5/8 x 3/4-inch meter	\$2.00	\$2.50
3/4-inch meter	3.00	3.60
1-inch meter	4.00	4.80
1 1/2-inch meter	5.00	6.00
2-inch meter	8.00	9.60
3-inch meter	14.00	16.80
4-inch meter	20.00	24.00

Each of the foregoing "Monthly Meter Minimums" will entitle the consumer to the quantity of water which that monthly meter minimum will purchase at the following "Monthly Quantity Rates."

MONTHLY QUANTITY RATES

First 400 cubic feet or less	\$2.00	\$2.50
Next 4,000 cu. ft. per 100 cubic feet	.30	.40
Next 40,000 cu. ft. per 100 cubic feet	.25	.35
Over 44,400 cu. ft. per 100 cubic feet	.20	.30

SUMMER HOME RATES (Valley Zone Only)

Applicable to consumers occupying homes for a portion of the year only.

Annual charge payable in advance entitling each consumer to 400 cubic feet of water per month for any period of eight consecutive months during the calendar year, 5/8 x 3/4 inch meter.....\$16.00

When water is used in excess of the above monthly allowance of 400 cubic feet per month or when used for additional months over the eight consecutive months in any calendar year covered by the sixteen dollar (\$16.00) annual payment, the regular monthly minimum and quantity rates shall apply.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, that the order in Decision No. 24832, dated June 6, 1932, shall remain in full force and effect, except as amended by this First Supplemental Order.
