ORIGINALOPINION and ORDER

Pacific Greyhound Lines, Inc. has made application to alter the route traversed between Tipton and Tulare. Applicant is now authorized to operate over the state highway between these points by crossing the tracks of the Southern Pacific Company at a point south of Tulare and following the railroad on the west side to a point north of Tipton where the highway again crosses the tracks to the east side. Recently a new highway has been constructed by the State on the east side of the track thus eliminating three railroad grade crossings. The changes will affect no fare points or time schedules.

This appears to be a matter in which a public hearing is unnecessary and that the application should be granted, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pacific Greyhound Lines, Inc. be and it hereby is authorized to reroute its vehicles between Tipton and Tulare via the new state highway and to abandon its operations as provided by Decision No. 23244 on Application No. 16989, via the highway between Tipton and Tulare, via Burling.
