OPINION and ORDER

Martha Sutherland, Administratrix of the Estate of Fred A. Sutherland, deceased, operating under the name "Sutherland's Tia Juana Stages," has made application for permission to abandon all passenger and property service between Coronado Beach and Palm City, via Silver Strand and Imperial Beach, and between Nestor and Aztec City and Monument, points on the international boundary between the United States and Mexico.

Applicant alleges that these operations involve 2688 miles of operation monthly at a cost of \$333.80 and that the revenues approximate only \$7.60 a month. Exhibit "A" attached to the application shows daily mileage and receipts as stated. The number of passengers during July was 55 (an average of 13.8 cents per passenger) and the largest revenue for a single day was \$1.20 (4 passengers). Two schedules daily have been maintained to all points. Applicant alleges that the losses other months are fairly comparable.

This is a matter in which we believe a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Martha Sutherland, Administratrix of the Estate of Fred A. Sutherland, deceased, operating "Sutherland's Tia Juana Stages," be and she is hereby author - ized to abandon all operations in the transportation of persons and property between Coronado Beach and Palm City, via Silver Strand and Imperial Beach, and between Nestor and Aztec City, and between Monument and International Gate No.2, provided applicant shall immediately file with this Commission her withdrawal and cancellation of tariffs and time schedules therefor now on file with this Commission, and providing applicant shall post notices in her stages and terminals and stations giving the public at least five (5) days notice of such abandonment and discontinuance of service; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that certificates of public convenience and necessity granted to Fred A. Sutherland by
Decision No.12644, dated September 21, 1923, on Application
No.9317; Decision No.21015, dated April 24, 1929, on Application
No.15552, and Decision No.16466, dated April 12, 1926, on
Application No.11708, be and the same hereby are revoked and
annulled.
