ORDER

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, on July 18, 1932, applied for authority to abandon its agency at Grass Lake Station on the Black Butte Subdivision of its Shasta Division in Siskiyou County, State of California.

A study of the Company's station records shows that \$43.19 passenger business was transacted at said station during the year ending June 30, 1932; that \$37.51 less-than-carload and \$605.54 carload business was transacted during the same period, the majority of the carload business being tank cars of water.

population consists entirely of Southern Pacific Company employees. The nearest agency to the east is at Leaf, a distance of 12.1 miles and to the west at Mount Shasta, a distance of 31.4 miles. The Company alleges in its application that the abandonment of said agency will not involve the abandonment of any facilities and that the station will be continued as a non-agency station and that in its opinion the continued maintenance of agent is not necessary for the business of applicant or for the public.
