Southern Pacific e Company, a corporation, on August hist, 1932, applied for authority to abandon its agency at Boulder Creek Station in Santa Cruz County, State of California. Accompanying the application is a comparative statement showing the amount of business transacted at said station during the tro-year period endive July 3ist, 1932, as follows:

Boulder Creek is located at the end of the Boulder Creek branch line, which extends from Boulder Creek to Felon, a distance of 7.3 miles, there being no agencies between these points. Appalcant does not operate any passenger trains on its Boulder Creek branch. The Pacific Greyhound Ines, however, connect with Southern Pacific Company "s Jos Altos-College Park-Santa Cruz branch at felon and provides passenger and baggage service to Boulder Creek.

In this proceeding it is not proposed to abendon any of the facilities, saia station to be continued as a non-agency station.

The Caifiornia Farm Bureau Foderation has signified, in writing, that it does not object to the granting of this appilcation.

A member of the Transportation Division of the Comission's Engineering Department has made an investigation of this matter and his report, based on an interview with interested shippers and recelvers of freight, indicetes there is no serious objection to the granting of this application.

The company has indicated that it pians to take care of less-than-carload shipments of storing them in warehouse under lock and key am that the company telephone located at the dopot is to be made available to patrons to communicate with the agent at Felton for the purpose of ordering cars, or for any other railroad business.

It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein and that the appilcation should be granted,

IT IS HERESY ORDERED that the Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to ebandon its agency at its station of Boulcer Creek, located on the Boulder Creek oranch of its Coast Division in Santa Cruz County and to change its station records and taritis accordingly, subject to the following conditions:
(1) Said agency is to be continued as a non-agency station.
(2) Southern Pacific Company shall store less-thancarioad shipments under lock and key in company's warehouse and the company telephone located at this station shall be mado avaliable to patrons; the key to both warehouse and telephone shall be obtainable from a custodian located at or near said station, notice of which shall be maintained at both warehouse and telephone, advising shippers where key may be obtained.
(3) Applicant shall give the public at least ton (10) days notice prior to the abandonment of said agency by posting such notice in a conspicuous place at said station.
(4) Applicant shall within thirty (30) days thereafter notify this Commission, in writing, of the abandonmont herein authorized and of their compliance with the conditions hereof.
(5) The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised withing one (1) year from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on
the date hereof.
