OPINION and ORDER

J. B. Crissel & Co., a copartnership composed of J. B. Crissell and J. F. Dolan, have petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order approving the sale and transfer by the copartnership to Joseph B. Spence of an operating right for an automotive service for the transportation of passengers and baggage between Nevada City and Grass Valley, and Joseph B. Spence has petitioned for authority to purchase and acquire said operating right and to hereafter operate thereunder, the sale and transfer to be in accordance with an agreement, a copy of which, marked Exhibit "A", is attached to the application herein and made a part thereof.

The consideration to be paid for the property herein proposed to be transferred is given as \$2000.00. Of this sum \$2000.00 is declared to be the value of equipment and nothing is declared to be the value of intengibles.

The operating right herein proposed to be transferred was created by Decision No.12970, dated December 31, 1923, on Application No.9243.

We are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

Toseph B. Spence is hereby placed upon notice that "operative rights" do not constitute a class of property which should be capitalized or used as an element of value in determining reasonable rates. Aside from their purely permissive aspect, they extend to the holder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business over a particular route. This monopoly feature may be changed or destroyed at any time by the state which is not in any respect limited to the number of rights which may be given.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled application be, and the same is hereby granted, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The consideration to be paid for the property herein authorized to be transferred shall never be urged before this Commission or any other rate fixing body as a measure of value of said property for rate fixing, or any purpose other than the transfer herein authorized.
- 2. Applicant J. B. Grissel & Co. shall immediately unite with applicant Joseph B. Spence in common supplement to the tariffs on file with the Commission covering service given under certificate herein authorized to be transferred, applicant J. B. Grissel & Co. on the one hand withdrawing, and applicant Joseph B. Spence on the other hand accepting and establishing such tariffs and all effective supplements thereto.
- 3. Applicant J. B. Grissel & Co. shall immediately withdraw time schedules filed in lists name with the Railroad Commission and applicant Joseph B. Spence shall immediately file, in duplicate, in his own name time schedules covering service heretofore given by applicant J. B. Grissel & Co., which time schedules shall be identical with the time schedules now on file with the Railroad Commission in the name of applicant J. B. Grissel & Co., or time schedules satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
- 4. The rights and privileges herein authorized may not be sold, leased, transferred nor assigned, nor service thereunder discontinued, unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such sale, lease, transfer, assignment or discontinuence has first been secured.

5. No vehicle may be operated by applicant Joseph B. Spence unless such vehicle is owned by said applicant or is leased by him under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
