OPINION AND ORDER

By this application Willard P. Smith, surviving partner of Smith and Smith, doing business under the name of Dairy Transportation Company, seeks authority to abandon an automotive service for the transportation of milk, cream and dairy products between certain portions of the City of Los Angeles to Burbank, Glandale and Los Angeles, and asks that the certificate therefor granted by Decision No. 23444, dated February 24, 1931, on Application No. 16969, be revoked. Applicant alleges that the service is now being conducted at a loss. The annual report for 1931 shows a deficit in operations of \$736.73.

This is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary, and good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that applicant be and he is hereby authorized to discontinue service as authorized by Decision No. 23444 on Application No. 16968 provided he shall notify all present patrons of his service fifteen (15) days before date of discontinuance.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the rights heretofore

granted by said Decision No. 23444 on Application No. 16968 be and they are hereby revoked effective when said applicant shall have filed with this Commission his statement showing when and to whom notice of discontinuance was made.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that upon the effective date of this order applicant shall cancel all tariffs and time schedules now on file with the Commission.
