OPINION

ORIGINAL

Charles A. Lindsey, operating an auto stage service between Randsburg and Searles by authority of Decision No.20719, dated January 25, 1929, on Application No.15168, requests authority to discontinue temporarily the transportation of passengers as a part of this service. Applicant alleges that during the entire years of 1930, 1931, and to October 24, 1932, only twenty seven (27) passengers were transported with a total revenue of \$40.50. During the same period the cost of insurance upon this service amounted to \$117.00. Applicant desires to be relieved of passenger service but will continue the handling of express and baggage between termini in connection with his U. S. Mail contract.

This is a matter in which we believe a public hearing is not necessary.

The application will be granted for a definite period, not later than June 1, 1933.

ORDER

Charles A. Lindsey having made application to suspend passenger service between Randsburg, Johannesburg and Searles temporarily, and it appearing to the Commission that there is now no public necessity for the continuation of such service,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that applicant be and he is hereby authorized to suspend all passenger service between termini and intermediate points until June 1, 1933, provided, however, that applicant will post notices at his termini and in his vehicles five (5) days prior to the effective date of such discontinuance and shall within ten (10) days of date of such discontinuance file with this Commission withdrawal of his time schedules and tariffs for the period named.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that said service shall be resumed on or before June 1, 1933, unless the Commission shall, by further order, extend the time of discontinuance.
