In the Matter of the Suspension by the Commission on its own motion of 6th revised page 522 of SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY Tariff 730-D, C.R.C. 3353, naming rates of 22 cents per 100 pounds for the transportation of sodium (soda), carbonate of and crude bi-carbonate of, from Searles, Cartago, Bartlett and Keeler to San Francisco and related points.

O P I N I O N

The Commission by order dated November 23, 1932, in the above entitled proceeding suspended until December 23, 1932, sixth revised page 522 of Southern Pacific Company Tariff 730-D, C.R.C. 3353, naming rates of 22 cents per 100 pounds, minimum carload weight 80,000 pounds, for the transportation of sodium (soda), carbonate of (soda ash, monohydrate or sesqui-carbonate) and sodium (soda), crude bi-carbonate of (saleratus) from Searles, Cartago, Bartlett and Keeler to San Francisco, Oakland, Alameda, Richmond, Pittsburg and points grouped therewith.

A public hearing was ordered for December 7, 1932, at San Francisco. Under date of December 5, 1932, the parties protesting the publication of these rates advised the Commission that respondent Southern Pacific Company had agreed to adjust the rate situation. They withdrew their opposition to the tariff item and rates, and requested that the suspension order be cancelled. The cause for suspension having been withdrawn, our

order of November 23, 1932, should accordingly be vacated and this suspension proceeding discontinued.

O R D E R

Upon consideration of all the facts of record, and good cause appearing therefor,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that our order of November 23, 1932, in the above entitled proceeding, suspending 6th revised page 522 of Southern Pacific Company Tariff 730-B, C.R.C. 3353, naming 22-cent rates on sodium (soda), etc., be and it is hereby vacated and set aside.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that this proceeding be and it is hereby discontinued.
