ORDER

The Pacific Gas and Electric Company having filed its application to this Commission for approval of a certain agreement entered into by and between applicant and the Gould Restaurant of Modesto, the hearing thereon was held at the Court Eouse in Modesto on December 14,1932, before Examiner Johnson.

The Modesto Irrigation District appeared by engineer and attorney to protest at any special agreement being entered into by the power company with a single consumer. But the testimony developed that the Pacific Gas and Electric Company would offer the same agreement, the same service and the same rates to any other like consumer, and the agreement incorporated with this application as Exhibit "A" was admitted to be the incorporation of the Modesto Irrigation District Rate Schedule C-3, together with the addition of the applicant's Standby Rate as represented by applicant's Schedule P-7.

This Commission having heretofore decided that the power company could meet the competition of the Municipal Corporation

the Modesto Irrigation District, by the same rates charged in that territory,

IT IS HEREBY OFDERED that the Agreement herein is approved by this Commission.
