ORDER OF DISMISSAL

The City of Los Angeles and Southern Pacific Company, respondents in the above entitled proceeding, have petitioned the Commission to dismiss this case. In their petition it is alleged that neither the city nor Southern Pacific Company are in a financial position to proceed with a separation at this location if ordered by the Commission, and point out that if conditions arise which warrant the reinstatement of the matter, it can at that time be again considered.

Respondents further allege that this crossing is now equipped with substantial automatic signals which in their opinion are affording reasonable and adequate protection.

In view of the above, particularly with reference to the financial situation, the Commission has determined for the present to dismiss this proceeding therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled matter is

hereby dismissed without prejudice.
