At the hearings on this application, evidence was presented by witnesses for protestants that applicant was not a proper party to receive a license as herein sought and as contemplated by the provisions of Chapter 638, Laws of 1931.

Since this matter was submitted, the Madison Insurance Company has, by written advice, notified the Commission that it desires to be relieved from liability as surety under the bond filed in this proceeding as required by the statutory law. It is our opinion based on the record and evidence in this proceeding that the application should be denied.
