FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Condition No. (1) of the
Commission's Order of its Decision No. 25079, dated August 22,
1932, in the above entitled proceeding which reads:

"Applicants shall afford the public at least five
(5) days' notice of such discontinuance of service
and abandonment of facilities by posting notice of
such discontinuance and abandonment at all stations
on said line and in all passenger cars or trains
operating over said line."

is modified to read as follows:

"Applicants shall afford the public at least five
(5) days' notice of such discontinuance of service
and abandonment of facilities by posting notice of
such discontinuance and abandonment at all stations
on said line and in all passenger cars or trains
operating over said line. Tariffs may be canceled
upon notice to this Commission and to the general
public by not less than ten (10) days' filing and
posting in the manner prescribed by the rules of
this Commission."

In all other respects Decision No. 25079 shall remain

in full force and effect.
