BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

In the matter of the application of Southern Pacific Company for permission to construct a spur track at grade across Orange Street in the City of El Centro, County of Imperial, State of California.

## ORDER

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, having on January 25th,1922 filed with the Commission an application for permission to construct a spor track at grade across Orange Street in the City of El Centro. County of Imperial, State of California, as hereinafter indicated, and it appearing to the Commission that this is not a case in which a public hearing is necessary; that the necessary franchise or permit has been granted by the Board of Trustees of said City of El Centro for the construction of said crossing at grade, and it further appearing that it is not reasonable nor practicable to avoid a grade crossing with said Orange Street, and that this application should be granted subject to the conditions hereinafter specified,

IT IS HERZEY ORDERED, that permission be and it is hereby granted Southern Pacific Company to construct a spor track at grade across Orange Street in the City of El Centro, County of Imperial, State of California, described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the south line of Orange Street, said point being distant 8.1 feet east of the center line of the Inter-California Railway Company's drill track as now located between New and Third Streets; thence northerly a distance of 70.5 feet, more or less, to a point in the north line of said Orange Street, said point being distant

13.5 feet east of the center line of said drill track, all of the above as shown by the map attached to the application; said crossing to be constructed subject to the following conditions; viz:

- (1) The entire expense of constructing the crossing, together with the cost of its maintenance thereafter in good and first-class condition for the safe and convenient use of the public shall be borne by applicant.
- (2) Said crossing shall be constructed of a width and type of construction to conform to that portion of Orange Street now graded, with grades of approach not exceeding two (2) per cent; shall be protected by a suitable crossing sign and shall in every way be made safe for the passage thereover of vehicles and other road traffic.
- (3) Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the completion of the installation of said crossing.
- (4) The authorization herein granted for the installation of said crossing shall lapse and become void one year from the date of this order unless further time is granted by subsequent order.
- (5) The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders relative to the location, construction, operation, maintenance and protection of said crossing as to it may seem right and proper, and to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, the public convenience and necessity demand such action.
