O P I N I O N

Applicants herein ask an order granting to George A. Abajian the right to transfer one-half interest in the auto truck milk route described in the title hereto to George J. Abajian for a consideration of Eight Hundred Fifty (\$850.00) Dollars.

A public hearing was held by Examiner Williams at Los Angeles, at which time the matter was duly submitted and now is ready for decision.

Applicants testified that they are cousins engaged in local trucking and that the milk route has become so large that additional financing is necessary. The operating right was purchased by George A. Abajian from Zadikian and Avoian,

(Decision No. 9712) in November, 1921, at which time One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars was paid. Both applicants said they were satisfied that Eight Hundred Fifty (\$850.00) Dollars is not too much now for a half interest. The purchaser agrees to furnish capital for a new and larger track to handle growing business. Both applicants fully understand that the consideration could never be the basis of rate fixing. As the transfer is in the interest of the shippers by providing improved facilities it should be approved.

O R D E R .

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled application be and the same is hereby granted, subject to the following conditions:

- I - That the consideration to be paid for the property herein authorized to be transferred shall never be urged before this Commission or any other rate fixing body as a measure of value for rate fixing or any other purpose, excepting the transfer herein authorized.
- II - That the applicant George A. Abajian will be required to immediately cancel all tariffs and time schedules now on file with the Railroad Commission, such cancellation to be in accordance with the provisions of General Order No. 51 and other regulations of the Railroad Commission.
- III - That the applicant George J. Abajian will be required to immediately file tariff and time schedules, in duplicate, in his own name, or to adopt as his own the tariffs and time schedules heretofore filed by George A. Abajian, all rates and time schedules to be identical with those filed by George A. Abajian.
- IV - That the rights and privileges herein authorized to be transferred may not be discontinued, sold, leased, transferred nor assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such discontinuance, sale, lease, transfer, or assignment has first been secured.

V - That no vehicle may be operated by the applicant George J. Abajian, unless such vehicle is owned by said applicant or is leased by him under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
