ORDER DENYING APPLICATION FOR REHEARING

This Commission, by Decision No. 9948, dated December 29, 1921, having made its order in the above entitled proceeding, and E. W. Peterson having subsequently made application for rehearing therein, and it appearing to the Commission that the only new matter presented in said application for rehearing was an allegation to the effect that recent heavy rains in San Diego County have so replenished the underground water sources that Coronado Water Company will be enabled to pump a large portion of its water supply at a considerable saving in expense over the cost of purchasing the supply from the City of San Diego, and further investigation of the situation having been made by the Commis-

sion's hydraulic engineers as provided for in said Decision No. 9948, and it appearing as a result of such investigation that the allegation of applicant for rehearing is not well founded and that sufficient provision has been made in said Decision so that all consumers of Coronado Water Company will be amply protected against unreasonable or exorbitant rates,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the application for rehearing herein be and the same is hereby denied.
