OPINION

A public hearing was held in San Francisco by Examiner Westover on above entitled application for authority to operate freight and express service between San Francisco and San Jose, of which due notice was given to all parties interested. Applicant did not appear, but the transportation companies, named above, appeared and presented testimony showing their respective equipment and service, from which it appears that they have abundant equipment and facilities to transport all traffic offered; that some of the companies are operating at a loss due to lack of patronage, that there is at present adequate and sufficient service to and from all of the points which Applicant proposes to serve, and that public convenience and necessity do not require the service proposed by him.

O R D E R

A public hearing having been held on the above entitled application, the matter having been submitted and now ready for decision,

The Railroad Commission hereby declares that public convenience and necessity do not require the operation by William H. Cokely of freight and express service between San Francisco and San Jose or any intermediate points, and

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the application be, and it is, hereby denied.
