FOURTH SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY having reported to the Railroad Commission that during the month of December, 1921, and during the month of January, 1922, it expended \$1,792,647.61 for plant extensions, additions and betterments as shown in Exhibit No. 4 filed with the fourth supplemental petition in the above entitled matter, and having asked permission to use not exceeding \$1,792,647.61 of the proceeds obtained, or which may be obtained, from the sale of stock which the Commission has heretofore authorized to be issued, to finance such expenditures,

AND the Railroad Commission having considered applicant's request and being of the opinion that the request should be granted, as herein provided:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY be, and it is hereby, authorized to use not exceeding \$1,792,647.61 of the proceeds obtained, or which may be obtained, from the sale of stock authorized to be issued and sold by orders in decisions in Applications Nos. 2743, 4790, 5312, 6426 and 7373, to finance such cost of the plant extensions, additions and betterments referred to in said Exhibit No. 4 filed with the fourth supplemental petition

in the above entitled matter, as may be properly chargeable to capital account under the uniform system of accounts prescribed and adopted by the Railroad Commission.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, that the orders in decisions in Applications Nos. 2743, 4790, 5312, 6426 and 7373 shall remain in full force and effect, except as modified by this Fourth Supplemental Order.
