BY THE COMMISSION:

O R D E R

I.H. SKILLMAN, doing business under the firm name and style of BIDWELL ELECTRIC COMPANY, having asked permission to sell his 60 K.V.A. hydroelectric plant and distributing system to the EMPIRE MILL AND ELECTRIC COMPANY, which has joined in the application, and it appearing that the purchasing company now owns the flume and water wheel used in connection with the operation of the electric plant and that it can operate said plant in conjunction with the operation of its grist and flouring mill and that it will continue to operate the plant;

AND the Commission being of the opinion that this is a matter on which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that I.H. SKILLMAN be, and he is hereby, authorized to sell his hydroelectric generating plant and distributing system described in this application to the EMPIRE MILL AND ELECTRIC COMPANY, which is hereby authorized to purchase said properties and to assume the payment of the indebtedness owing by I.H. Skillman on said properties.

The authority herein granted is subject to the following conditions:

- 1.--The consideration being paid for the properties by the Empire Mill and Electric Company shall not be urged before this Commission as a measure of value of the properties for the purpose of fixing rates or for any purpose other than the transfer herein authorized.
- 2.--Within thirty (30) days after the date of this order the Empire Mill and Electric Company shall file with the Commission a complete description of the properties acquired from I.H. Skillman.
