THEIR SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, this Commission in Decision No. 9239 in the above entitled matter, dated July 15, 1921, authorized Southern California Gas Company to charge and collect in addition to certain of its regular schedules, the sum of 3 cents per thousand cubic feet for gas service rendered, based on meter readings taken on and after August 1, 1921, and during such period as Los Angeles Gas and Electric Corporation was authorized to make a similar charge; and,

WHEREAS, investigation shows and an order has been made this day, that Los Angeles Gas and Electric Corporation discontinue the 3 cent per thousand cubic feet charge for service based upon regular meter readings taken on and after May 2, 1922;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, That Southern California Gas Company discontinue the charge of 3 cents per thousand cubic feet as heretofore authorized for service rendered based on all meter readings taken on and after May 2, 1922.
