THIRD SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, Southern Counties Gas Company of California has filed with this Commission in accordance with Decision No. 9127 in the above entitled matter, a stipulation setting forth that effective July 1st, 1922 Southern Counties Gas Company of California is able to purchase oil of a satisfactory quality at an average price of \$1.95 per barrel at its gas plant in Santa Barbara; and

WHEREAS, in the Commission's Decision No. 9127 it was specified relative to the rates therein:

"Upon the approval of the Railroad Commission of the State of California the above rates are subject to increase or decrease on the basis of 2.6¢ per 1000 cu.ft. for each 10 cents increase or decrease respectively in the cost of oil above or below the base cost of oil, which base cost herein is \$2.54 per barrel at the Company's plant. Change to be to the nearest cent."

and

WHEREAS, in Decision No. 9515 in Application No. 5234, dated September 14th, 1921, the Commission ordered Southern Counties Gas Company of California to reduce its rates as set forth

in Schedules Nos. 1, 2 and 3 in Decision No. 9127 twelve cents per 1000 cubic feet effective for all meter readings taken on and after the first day of October 1921.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the rates set forth in Schedules Nos. 1, 2 and 3 in Decision No. 9127 in Application No. 5234 be, and the same are, reduced an additional 3 cents per 1000 cubic feet, or a total of 15 cents per thousand cubic feet, effective for all meter readings taken on and after the first day of August, 1922.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Southern Counties Gas Company of California file with the Commission on or before August 1st, 1922 a revision of its schedules to comply with this order.
