SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

ORIGINAL

The Commission having heretofore entered its opinion and order, Decision No. 4092, in the above entitled proceeding, said order having provided that the Commission would thereafter make its order granting permission to the County of San Joaquin to construct the crossing applied for therein after said county of San Joaquin shall have constructed a certain connecting road, said county of San Joaquin having now constructed said connecting road, and it appearing that permission should be granted the County of San Joaquin to construct a public road at grade across the track of Southern Pacific Company near the southwest corner of Section 6, Township 3 South, Range 6 East, as hereinafter indicated,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that permission be, and it is hereby granted the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Joaquin, State of California, to construct a public road at grade across the track of Southern Pacific Company at a point located approximately 500 feet east of the southwest corner of Section 6, Township 3 South, Range 6 East, M. D.B. & M., as shown on the map attached to the application, said crossing to be constructed subject to the following

(1) The entire expense of constructing the crossing shall be borne by the applicant. The cost of its maintenance up to a line two (2) feet outside the rails shall be borne by the applicant. The maintenance of that portion of the crossing between the rails and two (2) feet outside thereof shall be borne by the Railroad Company.

(2) The crossing shall be constructed of a width not less than twenty-four (24) feet and at an angle of forty-eight (48) degrees forty-five (45) minutes to the railroad and with grade of approach not greater than four (4) per cent; shall be protected by a suitable crossing sign and shall in every way be made safe for the passage thereon of vehicles and other road traffic.

(3) Applicant, shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the completion of the installation of said crossing.

(4) The authorization herein granted for the installation of said crossing shall lapse and become void one year from the date of this order unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

(5) The Commission reserves the right to make such farther orders relative to the location, construction, operation, maintenance and protection of said crossing as to it may seem right and proper and to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, the public convenience and necessity demand such action.
