ORDER

T. L. Tally and Seymour Tally, co-partners, have filed an application with the Railroad Commission in which they petition for a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing the operation of an automobile stage line as a common carrier of freight and passengers between Glenn Ranch and San Bernardino, California.

Applicants operate a resort hotel at Glenn Ranch and due to the fact that there is no present public carrier operating between such points, they desire to establish service as herein proposed during the period June 1st to October 1st of each year.

It appearing that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA HERE-BY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require the operation by T. L. Tally and Seymour Tally, co-partners, of an automobile stage line as a common carrier of freight and passengers between Glenn Ranch and San Bernardino, California, during the period June 1st to October 1st of each year and a certificate of public convenience and necessity be, and the same hereby is granted, subject to the following conditions:

- l. That the certificate herein granted does not authorize the transportation of persons or property for compensation, except insofar as such persons or property are destined to or originate, at Glenn Ranch.
- 2. That T. L. Tally and Seymour Tally, copartners, shall immediately file within a period of
 not to exceed ten (10) days from date hereof, their
 written acceptance of the certificate herein granted
 and shall file within a period of not to exceed
 twenty (20) days from date hereof, in duplicate,
 tariff of rates and time schedules, and shall commence operation of service herein cuthorized within
 a period of not to exceed thirty (20) days from date
 hereof.
- 3. That the rights and privileges herein authorized shall not be discontinued, sold, leased, transferred nor assigned unless the written consent of the Rail-road Commission to such discontinuance, sale, lease, transfer or assignment has first been secured.
- 4. We wehicle may be operated by applicants T. L. Tally and Seymour Tally, co-partners, unless such wehicle is owned by them or is leased by them under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
