SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

On April 8, 1921, the Railroad Commission issued its Decision No. 8829 in the above entitled application, in which Decision it authorized the River Express Company, a corporation, to sell, and the Overland Transfer Company, a co-partnership, to purchase the operative right heretofore owned by the River Express Company, authorizing the operation of an automobile truck line as a common carrier of freight and express between Stockton and Oakland, California. On July 12, 1922, the Overland Transfer Company, by W. H. Sheets, one of the co-partners, filed a written statement with the Commission in which it was stated that the Overland Transfer Company had never operated under the certificate authorized to be transferred to them under Decision No. 8829, nor did the Company intend to operate in the future.

In view of these statements, and good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the certificate authorized to be transferred to the Overland Transfer Company under

Decision No. 8829 be and the same hereby is suspended until
further Order of the Railroad Commission.
