FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, in Decision No. 9840 in the above entitled matter, this Commission provided with reference to Schedules Nos. 1, 2 and 5 of Coast Counties Gas and Electric Company, that such rates would be subject to increase or decrease upon approval of the Railroad Commission on the basis of three cents (3¢) per 1000 cubic feet for each ten cent (10¢) increase or decrease respectively in the cost of oil above or below the price of \$1.65 per barrel in Santa Cruz and \$1.73 per barrel in Watsonville; and

WHEREAS, Coast Counties Gas & Electric Company now makes affidavit that on July 15th, 1922 the price paid for oil was reduced to \$1.40 per barrel in Santa Cruz and \$1.48 per barrel in Watsonville, this being a decrease of twenty-five cents (25¢) per barrel from the base prices on which rates were established in Decision No. 9840,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the rates set forth in Decision No. 9840 in Case No. 1660 designated as Schedules Nos. 1, 2 and 5 be, and they are hereby reduced by eight cents (8¢) per 1000 cubic feet effective for all regular meter readings taken on and after August 15, 1922.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Coast Counties Gas and Electric Company file with the Commission on or before August 15, 1922 a revision of these schedules to comply with this order.
