FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, in Decision No. 9397 in the above entitled matter, this Commission provided with reference to the rates therein established that such rates would be subject to increase or decrease upon approval of the Commission on the basis of 3¢ per 1000 cubic feet for each 10¢ increase or decrease respectively in the cost of oil above or below the price of \$1.50 per barrel at Monterey, and \$1.87 per barrel at Salinas, and

WHEREAS, Coast Valleys Gas & Electric Company now make statement that on July 15, 1922, the price paid for oil was reduced to \$1.25 per barrel, f.o.b. Monterey, this being a decrease of 25¢ per barrel from the base prices at both Monterey and Salinas, on which rates were established in Decision No. 9397,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the rates set forth in Decision No. 9397, in Case No. 1611, designated, as Schedules A and B, be, and they are hereby reduced by 7¢ per 1000 cubic feet, effective for all regular meter readings taken on and after August 15, 1922.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, that Coast Valleys Gas and Electric Company file with the Commission on or before August 15, 1922, a revision of its schedules to comply with this order.
