SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, in Decision No. 9725 in the above entitled matter, this Commission provided with reference to the rate schedules Nos. 1 and 3 therein established, that such rates, upon approval of the Railroad Commission would be subject to increase or decrease on the basis of 3 cents per 1000 cubic feet for each 10 cent increase or decrease respectively in the price of oil below the price of \$1.64 per barrel, and

WHEREAS, Contra Costa Gas Company has heretofore filed with this Commission an affidavit that the price paid for oil was reduced 8 cents per barrel and the Commission has in consequence, in Decision No. 9909, ordered a reduction of 2 cents per 1000 cubic feet, and

WHEREAS, Contra Costa Gas Company now files affidavit that in accordance with the terms of a contract submitted to it, the price of oil to Contra Costa Gas Company will be, on and after July 15, 1922, \$1.31 per barrel,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that the rates set forth in Decision No. 9725 be and they are hereby reduced to 10 cents per 1000 cubic feet, effective for all meter readings taken on and after August 15, 1922, this being a further reduction of 8 cents per 1000 cubic feet.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER OFDERED, that the Contra Costa Gas Company file on or before August 15, 1922 a revision of its schedules to comply with this order.
