ORDER

Under Decision No. 10240 in Application No. 7393 the
Railroad Commission granted B. W. Belyea, doing business
under the fictitious name of Belyea Truck Line, a certificate
of public convenience and necessity authorizing the opera-
tion of an automobile truck line as a common carrier of freight
between Los Angeles and Eagle Rock City.

Applicant has now filed his present application in
which he states that he has been operating under said certi-
ficate for a period of ninety days; that every effort has
been made to develop the business, but that he has found that
due to the proximity of Eagle Rock to Los Angeles, the majority
of Los Angeles business firms include Eagle Rock in their
free delivery zone and that there is little, if any, merchandise
moving from Eagle Rock to Los Angeles, and the business cannot
be rendered profitable. He, accordingly, petitions for an
order authorizing him to discontinue service.

In view of the fact that there is additional service
by other common carriers between the points covered by the
operative right heretofore granted to applicant herein; that
apparently no shippers or receivers of freight will be injured
through the discontinuance of service as herein applied for.

we are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled application be, and the same hereby is granted subject to the following condition:

Applicant shall file cancellation of the tariff of rates and time schedules on file with the Railroad Commission, such cancellation to become effective on the date service is discontinued, which date shall not exceed ten (10) days from date of order herein.
