SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, in Decision No. 9830 in the above entitled matter, this Commission provided with reference to the rates established in Decision No. 8459 that such rates after being reduced by 8 cents per 1000 cubic feet, as provided therein, would be subject to increase or decrease, upon approval of the Railroad Commission, on the basis of 1.5 cents per 1000 cubic feet for each 10 cent increase or decrease respectively in the price of oil above or below the price of \$1.70 per barrel at Stockton, and

WHEREAS, Western States Gas and Electric Company, having heretofore filed with the Commission an affidavit that the price paid for oil had been reduced by 25 cents per barrel, and the Commission having in consequence in Decision No. 10786 ordered a reduction of 4 cents per 1000 cubic feet, and

WHEREAS, Western States Gas and Electric Company now makes affidavit that on August 8, 1922 the price paid for oil was reduced to \$1.20 per barrel, this being a further reduction of 25 cents and a total decrease of 50 cents per barrel from the base price on which rates were established in Decision 9830,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that the gas rates established in Decision 9830 in Case 1664, be, and they are hereby reduced by 7 cents per 1000 cubic feet effective for all regular meter

readings taken on and after September 8, 1922, this being a further reduction of 3 cents per 1000 cubic feet.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, that Western States Gas and Electric Company file with the Commission on or before September 8, 1922 a revision of its schedule to comply with this Order.
